Directors must attend both sessions of the Administrators course.


The Director that attends the revised Administrators course is required to be present for the scheduled TACIT visits.

It will highlight how, through our diversity, we can build strong supportive relationships that will serve as models to the children, families, and colleagues.

Outcomes will be reduced stress, relationship building that promotes greater academic and social-emotional development that enhances professionalism, and leadership of early childhood professionals.

Breastfeeding Basics - HSN -- Basic Level -- Renee Stonebraker

How breastmilk is produced, advantages and disadvantages of breastfeeding, and how to encourage breastfeeding at a childcare center.

Childhood Obesity - HSN -- Basic Level -- Renee Stonebraker

This training discusses the causes of childhood obesity and ways to prevent it.

<u>Creating an Autism Friendly Classroom</u> - Child Growth & Dev. - Envir. & Cur.- Basic Level -- Missy Cuppett
This is an online training for early childhood educators seeking information on creating an autism friendly classroom through the use of visual schedules, social stories, calm down corners and more. This training was created
for educators working with children in preschool/pre-k/school age classrooms.

<u>How to Teach Kids About Their Awesome Brain and BIG Emotions</u> - *CG&D* - *Basic Level* -- *Linda Reeves*Sometimes our brains are overwhelmed with strong emotions and feelings, creating confusion for children and adults. Giving children and adults a vocabulary to understand emotional experiences can help adults to know how to respond when children need help. This **1.5 hour online training** will discuss how to talk to children about their brains and emotions in a playful and simple way, especially when they "flip their lids"! This training is appropriate for anyone working with children ages 3 and older.

New Recipe Ideas 2 - HSN -- CG&D - Basic Level -- Renee Stonebraker

This training provides nutritional information and recipes for unique food from most food groups.

<u>Pre-K Early Learning Standards Framework</u> - Envir. & Curriculum - Basic Level -- Missy Cuppett & Amy McMillan This 2-hour online training will give a basic overview of the WV Early Learning Standards Framework, Preschool Edition. This training is intended for those who work with children ages 3-5 years old.

<u>Self Care Isn't Selfish</u> - Professionalism and Leadership - Basic Level -- Chris Gillis

Caregivers of young children are the most nurturing and loving people, yet often put themselves at risk for early burnout. Participants will rediscover the importance of self care and discuss burnout prevention.

<u>TEAMWORK! Working Together to Make it Work</u> - Fam. & Com. Partnerships -Prof. & Lead. - Admin. & Man. - Basic Level -- Missy Cuppett & Amy McMillan

This online training is for beginning early childhood educators looking for tips, tricks and positive ways to work together in Child Care Centers. During this two-hour training, the presenters and participants will discuss the importance of professionalism, self-care, and ways to build strong relationships with coworkers.

The 3 R's: Reaching the Learning Brain in Young Children - CG&D - Child Ob. & Assm't - Basic Level - Linda Reeves Early childhood educators are continually faced with young children who have experienced adversity or trauma in their lives who are struggling with learning and behavioral challenges at home and/or in the classroom. This 1.5 hour online training will explore specific practical strategies to help vulnerable young children to think, learn and reflect using the model of the 3 R's (Regulate, Relate, Reason) developed by Dr. Bruce Perry, MD, a pioneering neuroscientist in the field of trauma. Open to all who work with infants, toddlers, and preschoolers in a variety of settings.

Health & Safety Grants

Health and safety grant applications are available through CCRC to family childcare providers and family childcare facilities in Hancock, Brooke, Ohio, Marshall, Wetzel, Tyer, Monongalia and Marion Counties.

The grants can be used to assist family and facility childcare providers with meeting health and safety requirements as well as to reward them for completing the requirements to move up a tier on the tiered reimbursement program.

Providers are eligible for up to \$250.00 for registered home providers and up to \$500.00 for family childcare facilities once a year. If you have not received a health and safety grant for this year (starting July 1, 2021) and are interested in receiving free health and safety items for your home or facility, please contact your local CCRC Office to request a grant application.







Eligibility is not based on income.
