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

Frequently Asked Questions

Question: Why isn't the training I want to register for on the WV STARS training calendar?

Answer: Here are a few explanations -

1. The training has not yet been registered on the training calendar.
2. The training is full and will not accept additional participants
3. The training has been cancelled - *if you were previously registered you would receive an email notifying you of the cancellation.*
4. Trainings are "Closed" and removed from view on the training calendar 24 to 48 hours prior to the training to allow trainers to prepare materials and handouts for the registered participants.

“3 Simple Words” - Handle with Care: *Child Growth and Development - Intermediate Level -- Linda Reeves*
 During this training. Participants will have a better understanding of the impact of trauma on a child’s ability to learn. There will be discussion on the Handle with Care program in West Virginia and how this proven classroom and program-wide intervention process helps children exposed to trauma in early child care and educational programs. In addition, specific collaborative efforts that better serve children exposed to trauma will be discussed and promoted. This training is appropriate for child care providers of children of all ages and their families.

Ages & Stages Questionnaires: Social Emotional-2 (ASQ:SE2) - *Child Growth & Development - Intermediate Level -- Janice Barnett*
 This training will provide participants with an overview of the Ages and Stages Questionnaires Social Emotional Ages & Stages is a screening tool designed to be completed by parents and/or caregivers to screen children behaviors in 7 areas: Self Regulation; Compliance, Adaptive Functioning; Autonomy; Affect; Social Communication and Interaction with people. This training is directed toward teachers, directors and in-home providers of children 1 to 72 months. Practice screenings will be conducted by the participants. Participants will learn how to score the screening as well as follow-up and communicate the results..

Book It! The Building Blocks of Literacy - *Child Growth & Development- Basic Level -- Amy Morrow*
 This training will present skills for effective parent conferencing, such as asking and listening. We will create an action plan and share ideas to improve our family conferences so they are a positive experience for everyone. This training is geared towards all types of providers caring for all ages of children.

Developmentally Appropriate Practices in Early Childhood Programs - *Child Growth and Development Basic Level -- Erika Cool*
 This training will provide participants with an overview of NAEYC’s Position on Developmentally Appropriate Practice (DAP). DAP is at the core of being an excellent Early Childhood Professional. This training will discuss how to promote excellence, quality and optimal learning and development by applying developmentally appropriate practice.

How Do Infants & Toddlers Communicate? - *Child Growth & Development- Basic Level -- Chrissy Pownell*
 Through this training we will discuss developmental milestones regarding communication, red flags of communication, ways to promote communication, and how to support bilingual communication

Just Smile - *Professionalism and Leadership - Intermediate Level -- Chris Gillis*
 It is time to stop stressing and start smiling again! Let’s take time to identify the cause of our everyday stressors, and discuss techniques to prevent burnout commonly found among child care professionals.

Mandated Reporter: Reporting and Preventing Child Abuse & Neglect-*HSN-Intermediate Level -- Linda Reeves in Ohio County -- Sydney Cheesebrough Clark in Monongalia and Marion Counties*
 This training is a comprehensive training session for mandated reporters of child abuse and neglect.

Medication Administration - *HSN - Intermediate Level -- Glenna Bailey*
 This session will discuss proper administration of medication in the child care setting; guidelines of the WV Child Care Center Regulations.

Rolling in the Dough - *Child Growth & Development- Basic Level -- Missy Anderson*
 This session is all about the important role that Play-Dough plays in a child care setting. Play-Dough should be a staple in every child’s life. This session will discuss why play-dough is so important and more than just a mess.





Training Topics Offered -- July, August & September

Science Here, Science, There, Science Everywhere - *Child Growth & Development - Intermediate Level*
Missy Anderson

This training will provide participants with simple, inexpensive science activities for pre-school children. We will explore a wide range of scientific, hands-on activities that support children’s cognitive development.

Stress Management - *.50 hour Child Growth & Dev., .50 hour HSN, 1 hour Professionalism and Leadership*
Basic Level -- Renee Stonebraker

In this training you will learn facts about stress, how it affects our health, and healthy ways to deal with stress for adults and children.

WV Early Learning Standards Framework for Pre-K - *Environment & Curriculum -- Chris Gillis in Ohio County, Missy Anderson in Monongalia and Marion Counties*

Participants of this professional development session will become familiar with the West Virginia Early Learning Standards Framework. Discussion and planning will include the purpose, areas of development covered and how to incorporate the standards into curriculum planning. Follow up Technical Assistance will be offered for additional STARS credit to help with incorporation into curriculum.

Why Do They Do That? - *Child Growth & Development -- Chrissy Pownell*

When it comes to infants and toddlers in your setting do you ever find yourself asking the question “Why do they do that?” If so this training is for you. Come and explore ways to understanding behaviors.

What is the **Key 2 a Healthy Start** for WV's Children?

Did you know that approximately 32% of children ages 2-19 are overweight or obese? The trend begins in early childhood with 27% of children ages 2-5. By taking part in the **Key 2 a Healthy Start** initiative, WV child care centers can become leaders in reducing childhood obesity rates in WV and raising a healthier generation of kids.


Key 2 a Healthy Start is a statewide quality improvement initiative in early care and education with the goal of preventing childhood obesity. Participating child care centers attend 3 one-day workshops that cover:

- * Nutrition
- * Garden-based learning
- * Parent Engagement & outreach
- * Physical activity
- * Personal health and wellness
- * Healthy celebrations





Workshop presenters include a pediatrician, registered dietician and pediatric exercise physiologist. Each participating program also receives on-site technical assistance visits after each workshop and will become part of a peer learning network. **Key 2 a Healthy Start** centers receive MyPlate portion plates and placemats, portable physical activity equipment, parent outreach materials, and much more! The workshops are free and WV STARS registered.

Child Care Resource Center received the Governor's STEM Initiative Mini Grant in the amount of \$3,000. This grant allowed us to purchase hands on, creative and problem solving materials in the areas of science, technology, engineering and math. STEM Training was held at the CCRC in Wheeling on May 4th - those in attendance had the opportunity to participate in educational and fun activities that they were able to take back to the classroom and include into their Pre-K and afterschool curriculums.



Participants must work with subsidized children up to 35 months for 20 hours or more a week and MUST be registered with WV STARS.
