**Ages & Stages Questionnaires: Social Emotional-2 (ASQ:SE)**- CGD -- *Advanced Level* -- Janice Barnett

This training will provide participants with an overview of the Ages and Stages Questionnaires Social Emotional. Ages and Stages SE2 is a screening tool designed to be completed by parents and/or caregivers to screen social-emotional development in children 1 to 72 months. Participants will practice and score screenings. **This training is geared toward teachers, directors, and family childcare providers of children 1 to 72 months.**

**Being a Good Role Model** - *Child Growth & Dev.; Envir. & Cur.; HSN - Basic Level* - Renee Stonebraker

This training focuses on how adults words and actions can affect children’s health habits, including personal hygiene, food choices and physical activity.

**Professional Development Descriptions Continued**

**Creative Curriculum Overview for Pre-School Classrooms** - *Envir. & Cur.- Basic Level - Mariah Burnley*

Creative Curriculum® for Preschool is a comprehensive, research-based curriculum that promotes exploration and discovery as a way of learning, enabling children to develop confidence, creativity, and lifelong critical thinking skills. This session will provide you with a basic overview of the curriculum. **This training is intended for Preschool teachers.**

**Challenging Behaviors** - *Child Growth & Development - Intermediate Level - Ali Svolos*

This training provides participants with an overview of prevention, guidance, effective responses, and positive behavior support for challenging behaviors. Participants will be given prevention and intervention strategies for common challenging behaviors. This session is based on multiple research-based resources.

**This session is for staff working with children ages 3-5.**

**Guidance & Discipline with Infants and Toddlers** - *Child Growth & Dev.- Basic Level -- Chrissy Pownell*

This training is geared for those who work with infants and toddlers (Birth to 36 months). Key concepts include the following: Define socialization, guidance and discipline; Define developmental approaches to socialization, guidance, and discipline with infants and toddlers; Define socialization techniques and strategies for infants and toddlers; discuss prevention and intervention strategies for infants and toddlers challenging behaviors.

**Look What I Made** - *CG&D .5 Hours ,Environment & Curriculum 1.5 hrs. - Basic Level -- Mariah Burnley*

The training will uncover what process art is and how it can benefit your classroom. The session demonstrates how to encourage children's creativity through developmentally appropriate art experiences. The session will discuss how to provide open-ended, creative art experiences in the classroom, tips for leading process focused art and what children learn developmentally from process art. **This session will demonstrate activities appropriate for children ages 3-12, however can be altered for younger ages.**

**Mandated Reporter: Reporting and Preventing Child Abuse & Neglect** - *HSN-Basic Level*

*Linda Reeves in Wheeling --- Ali Svolos in Morgantown*

This training is the approved course for child care providers in recognizing, reporting and preventing child abuse and neglect.

**Medication Administration** - *HSN - Intermediate Level -- Karen Gilbert in Morgantown and Glenna Bailey in Wheeling*

This session will discuss proper administration of medication in child care settings.

**Oral Health** - *CGD : Environment & Curriculum; HSN - Basic Level - Renee Stonebraker*

Importance of dental care for children, proper procedure for brushing teeth in a child care center for each age group and oral health activities

**Playground Supervision** - *Curriculum/Environment -- HSN -- Basic Level -- Missy Cuppett*

Many of the injuries that occur in child care settings happen while outside on the playground. This 2 hour training will provide participants with information regarding the importance of outdoor play, how to utilize active supervision on the playground, and promoting positive behaviors while outdoors.

**Preschool Safe Environments** - *HSN - Basic Level --Mariah Burnley*

Your supervision is the most powerful tool you have to keep children safe. This lesson focuses on ways to provide appropriate supervision both indoors and outdoors. It also addresses ways to maintain accountability for children's safety. This lesson will also help you understand why ratios are important, what ratio is right for your program, and how to solve common problems. **This session will mainly focus on support for preschool classrooms.**

**Professional Ethics in Child Care** - *Professionalism and Leadership - Basic Level -- Missy Cuppett*

Providers will gain an awareness of what appropriate ethical responsibilities they hold as child care providers.

The Code of Ethics will be discussed as well as the difference between the Code of Ethics and Personal Values in the child care setting.

**Safe Sleep Practices** - *HSN Basic Level - Renee Stonebraker*

Guidelines on how to reduce the risk of SID and suffocation for infants up to 1 year old and sleep guidelines for older children.

**Social Emotional Development in Infants and Toddlers** - *Child Growth & Dev. - Basic Level -- Chrissy Pownell*

This training is geared for those that work with infants and toddlers (Birth to 36 months). Key Concepts include the following: Identify social emotional milestones for infants and toddlers; Discuss identity in infants and toddlers; Define responsive caregiving.

**STEM** - *Child Growth & Dev -- Environment and Curriculum - Intermediate Level -- Chris Gillis*

Come join in on the fun as we explore S.T.E.M We will learn about the different aspects of STEM, the benefits of integrating STEM into your daily learning activities and learn and explore in a hands-on way as we look at each part of STEM. **The training is for providers of all types who work primarily with preschool age children.**

**Story S-t-r-e-t-c-h-e-r-s for Infants, Toddlers & Two's** - *CGD; Envir. & Cur. - Intermediate Level -- Janice Barnett*

It's never too early to read to a child. This training will show how a book can be extended into all learning domains. Hands on activities will be provided to "stretch" the story.

**This training is geared toward infant/toddler teachers, in home providers and home visitors of infants and toddlers.**

**Stress Management** - *HSN ; Child Growth & Dev.; Prof. & Leadership - Basic Level - Renee Stonebraker*

Facts about stress, how it affects our health, and healthy ways to deal with stress for adults and children.

**Watch Me Grow! Monitoring Early Development and Sharing Concerns with Families** - *CGD - Basic Level -- Linda Reeves*

Childcare providers are in a unique role to monitor developmental milestones and provide support and resources to families, particularly during the first critical years of life. This training will review key developmental milestones during the first 5 years of life and discuss tools to help you work with families to monitor children's development, share your concerns with families, and help families get connected to services and support that can make a real difference. Based on the CDC's "Learn the Signs. Act Early" program.

**As of January 1, 2020 the following WV STARS Policy went into effect:**

In order to receive training credit hours for a repeating face to face course it has to have been a minimum 12 months since the course has been previously completed. Individuals choosing to repeat a course again inside the 12-month period will be treated as a student auditing a course and will be marked as completed but will receive no training credit hours.

Self-paced courses are not repeatable for credit.

Participants are encouraged to seek out training and professional development opportunities that would most benefit their professional growth.

## Trauma Informed Care Summit

Wheeling CCRC - Saturday - October 10, 2020

This training will look at the impact of trauma on young children that can have long lasting and sometimes devastating effects on development and behavior. Such effects can also affect caregivers through what is known as Secondary, or Vicarious, Trauma.

Trauma effects can be lessened when adults intentionally prepare for potential threats, implement strategies that enhance nurturing, create a sense of safety for children, and adopt self-care strategies to lessen secondary trauma.

This all day - 6 hour WVSTARS approved training will also cover Emergency Preparedness - discussing emergencies, injuries and emergency contact information. Reviewing established emergency procedures and safety practices will be included.



Everyone living in the United States is asked to complete a simple questionnaire every ten years that asks for basic information about the people who live or sleep in their home. Children under the age of five, however, are often missed.

Young children who are missed in the census tend to live with large, extended families or with multiple families living under one roof. When newborn babies and children are not counted, support for programs such as health insurance, hospitals, childcare, food assistance, schools, and early childhood development is impacted.

Responding to the census is easier than ever. You can complete the census questionnaire online, by phone, or by mail.

And remember, just as you protect the children in your care, the U.S. Census Bureau protects your information. The Census Bureau is required by law to protect any personal information collected and keep it strictly confidential. All Census Bureau staff take a lifetime oath to protect your personal information and any violation of this oath comes with a penalty of up to \$250,000 and/or up to five years in prison.
