


Mind In The Making! Fairmont - Marion County

Training Topics Offered January - March

Battling the Biter - Child Growth & Dev.; Environment & Curriculum - *Intermediate Level -- Linda Reeves*

Biting is an inevitable part of life for children in child care, particularly with infants and toddlers. This training explores some of the reason why children bite (infants, toddlers and preschoolers) and outlines some strategies on how to address biting situations in child care settings

Beans....More Than Just Cute Songs - HSN - Basic Level - *Renee Stonebraker*

Nutritional and health benefits of beans, how to use beans in a CAAFP menu, bean recipe's and warnings about beans.

Child Development and Assessment of Young Children - CGD and Child Ob. & Assm't - Basic Level - *Becca Lief*

This training examines the biological, psychological and emotional stages of child development.

Developmentally appropriate assessments will be presented and utilized as participants assemble portfolios.

Communicable Diseases - HSN - Basic Level - *Ronda Hopkins*

Communicable diseases are common in child care settings. This training will provide information about how to recognize and treat common childhood infectious disease. This includes information about symptom recognition and guidelines for exclusion.

Developmentally Appropriate Practices in Early Childhood Programs - Professionalism & Leadership -

Basic Level -- Missy Cuppett

Providers will gain an awareness of what appropriate ethical responsibilities they hold as child care providers.

The Code of Ethics will be discussed as well as the difference between the Code of Ethics and Personal Values in the child care setting.

Infection Control in the Child Care Setting - HSN - Basic Level -- *Ronda Hopkins*

During this training we will review Blood borne pathogens and transmission; Universal Precautions; Gloving; EPA information and disinfecting/sanitizing solutions and Exclusion. **This is a 1 Hour Training.**

ITERS - Importance and Value in the Classroom - Envir. & Curriculum- Intermediate Level -- *Janice Barnett*

The Infant/Toddler Environment Rating Scale-Revised is designed to assess group programs for children from Birth to 2 1/2 years of age. This training will provide an overview of the ITERS-R and allow participants the opportunity to practice observing and rating infant/toddler classroom environments. The training is geared to Center Directors and Infant/Toddler Teachers.

Let's Make a Menu - HSN - Tier 1 -- *Renee Stonebraker*

Join us to learn about MyPlate food groups, Leap of Taste guidelines, and how to build a menu with Leap of Taste.

Mandated Reporter: Reporting and Preventing Child Abuse & Neglect - HSN-Basic Level -- *Linda Reeves in*

Wheeling --- Sydney Cheesebrough in Morgantown

This training is the approved course for child care providers in recognizing, reporting and preventing child abuse and neglect. This includes understanding the role of the mandated reporter, recognizing warning signs of child abuse and neglect and increasing protective factors for families and communities

Medication Administration - HSN - Intermediate Level -- *Ronda Hopkins*

This is the training that is required that allows child care providers to administer medications to children in the child care setting. Topics include state regulation requirements, best practices and special situations. The participant must complete requirements of the training in order to be able to administer medications.

No Bad Kids - Education About Biting Behaviors - HSN - Basic Level - *Sydney Cheesebrough*

A beginners look into the function of children's biting behaviors; there are no bad kids and there are no "biters", just children with behaviors that require additional support. Learn about the stages of development and their relation to biting behaviors, functions of biting behaviors and ideas for working with children with biting behaviors.

Play Smart - Environment & Curriculum - Intermediate Level -- *Chris Gillis*

Participants will review and discuss the benefits of child-directed and adult-facilitated play and learning.

This training is geared for all child care providers.

Sensory Play: Let's Have Some Fun - Basic Level -- *Chrissy Pownell*

Why sensory play? Come and explore the benefits of sensory play and learn how to incorporate it into your day.

Understanding Pre-Schoolers



Based on the *Winning Ways for Early Childhood Professionals* by Gigi Scweikert

This 8 hour module series PLUS 1 hour Technical Assistance visit will give early childhood educators a better understanding and appreciation of how preschoolers develop, learn, communicate and typically behave. This training will include group discussions and activities which will help participants to take their new skills and confidence into their classroom and better prepare their students for their transition into kindergarten. The Understanding Preschoolers module series is best geared towards preschool/pre-kindergarten teachers or those working with children between the ages of 3 and 5 years old.
