





July - August - September Professional Development Training Descriptions

All About Me! Welcoming New Children in Your Care - CGD, Family & Com. Partnerships. - Basic Level - Linda Reeves --- Online Regardless of whether a child is new to a childcare center/home/facility, being moved to a new classroom, or is moved for part of the day, there are things we can do to make this transition easier. This 1.5 hour training will discuss practical strategies to help prepare a child for new settings. This training is appropriate for those working with children birth to grade school age in a variety of childcare settings.

Creating An Autism Friendly Classrooms - CGD, Environment & Curriculum - Basic Level - Melissa Cuppett--- Online This training is for early childhood educators seeking information on creating an autism friendly classroom through the use of visual schedules, social stories, calm down corners and more. This training was created for educators working with children in preschool/ pre-k/school age classrooms.

<u>Diving Into The World of Treasure Baskets</u> - CGD, - Basic Level - Tiffany Kiess --- In-Person

This session will introduce the world of treasure baskets to caregivers with information from the book entitled, *Treasure Basket* Explorations, by Laura Wilhelm. We will cover the following components as talked about in the book, what is a treasure basket, creating a space for exploration, how to create and introduce treasure baskets, creating treasure baskets to meet specific goals and treasure baskets by age.

Glow Germ Pre-K/*S.T.E.A.M. - Environment & Curriculum, HSN - Basic Level - Amy McMillan --- Online Glow Germ Pre-K is a one hour training. Participants will learn how to integrate health, science, and the arts into their Pre-K curriculum. This module also helps build children's resiliency by providing hands on, exploratory activities dealing with a current, real-world situation in their lives. Participants will learn how to help young children learn what they can do to help keep themselves and others safe and can feel empowered that there are things they do have control over.

Help! I Need a Quiet Space! - CGD, Envir & Curriculum - Basic Level - Linda Reeves --- Online

A quiet space is a specific physical space or area in a room where a child can go to cool off or calm down during conflict, when overwhelmed or frustrated or just to take a break. This 1.5 hour training will discuss setting up a designated quiet space in childcare settings and homes as well as an overview of specific self-calming techniques to promote in infants, toddlers and young children.

Improving Playground Safety & Supervision - Environment & Curriculum; HSN - Basic Level -- Melissa Cuppett --- Online Many of the injuries that occur in childcare settings happen while outside on the playground. This training will provide participants with multiple ways to improve playground supervision/safety while working to decrease the number of incidents occurring on the playground. This training is targeted for those in the preschool and after-school programs.

Maximizing Learning in the Preschool Classroom - CGD, Environment & Curriculum; - Basic Level -- Melissa Cuppett --- Online This training is for beginning early childhood educators seeking information on how to create a preschool classroom that will help our young learners thrive. This training will focus on the development of children ages 3-5 and appropriate classroom set up in a preschool classroom.

New Recipe Ideas 1- CGD, HSN - Basic Level -- Renee Stonebreaker --- In-Person

Provides nutritional information and recipes for unique foods to try from most food groups.

Picky Eaters - CGD, Environment & Curriculum, HSN - Basic Level - Renee Stonebraker --- Online

How to encourage children to eat a variety of foods, including different cooking methods, family style meals, and food shapes.

Planting Seeds for Healthy Eating - CGD, HSN - Basic Level - Renee Stonebraker --- Online & In-Person

Benefits of gardening, different types of gardens, how to grow food in a container, and garden food safety.

Ready, Set, Read, with TRAILS! - Prof. & Leadership - Basic Level - Chris Gillis --- In-Person

Giving children the best start in the early years is critical to developing a lifelong love of reading and learning. Participants will learn how the TRAILS program can support their literacy program and engage in a make and take project.



July - August - September Professional Development Training Descriptions Continued

<u>Stress Management</u> - *CGD, Professionalism and Leadership, HSN - Basic Level - Renee Stonebraker --- Online* Facts about stress, how it affects our health, and healthy ways to deal with stress for adults and children.

<u>The Very Hungry Worry Monster/Pre-K Literacy</u> - Environment & Curriculum - Basic Level - Amy McMillan --- In-Person
From Once Upon a Story Literacy Series, this 1.5 hour training provides Pre-K educators with fun and creative ways to bring literacy into their Pre-K setting. The class will focus on a specific story, *The Very Hungry Worry Monster*, used as a model for how early childhood providers can learn to use the technique of "Mind Mapping" to invoke student interest and previous knowledge in the development of literacy connected learning activities. This supports the Creative Curriculum child focused instructional model.



Common Mistakes Found on Monthly Child Care Billings

Subsidy staff strive to meet our childcare provider needs in processing payments each month.

Please review the following common mistakes that are found on the monthly payment forms to help you receive your childcare payments in a timely manner.

- 1. Providers should not accept a child for subsidy or essential care without a childcare certificate. All CCRC clients are mailed 2 certificates: one for their client's records and the second to give to the childcare provider. Providers also receive a provider notification letter in the mail. Due to the volume of calls CCRC is currently receiving we ask that providers please check the certificates and/or the providers notice before contacting CCRC to be informed of the daily fee and the parent's eligibility date.
- 2. Providers cannot bill for days prior to the family's eligibility/start date. Please review their certificate or your provider notification letter for this information.
- **3.** Before submitting the payment request forms to CCRC, providers should check for common mistakes such as incorrect birthdays and/or incorrect child fees listed on the request for payment form. Forms will be returned to the provider for corrections when these are incorrect or missing.
- **4.** White Out cannot be used on any of the billing forms. If white out is used, it will be returned to the childcare provider. When a mistake occurs on the billing forms, please have the individual making the mistake draw a line through the error, enter correct information, and then initial the change.
- **5.** Child Care Fees:
 - **a.** For families that currently have a childcare fee, please make sure that you are giving the family a receipt anytime that the fee is paid.
 - **b.** Daily fees can only be charged for the days a child is in the provider's care. For families that use 4 hours or more the full daily fee will be charged to the parent.
 - c. For families that use 4 hours or more the full daily fee will be charged to the parent.
 - **d.** If a child is in your care for less than four hours daily, you are required to use the daily conversion chart as these are considered part days. Visit our website ccrcwv.org under provider tab for a copy of the part day fee conversion chart (included in the instructions or childcare daily fees)

Registration is open and fall classes will be returning to in-person! We will also offer one virtual class for each of the four semesters. Counties that do not typically have in-person classes will have priority in registering for the virtual classes. All other students wishing to participate virtually will be enrolled in the order they complete the registration process. The maximum number of students for a virtual class is 15. The registration deadline is August 20, 2021. Students applying for virtual classes will be notified of their acceptance after August 20, 2021. All classes will begin the week of August 30, 2021. HOW TO REGISTER FOR CLASSES

- All students must complete an online orientation for the semester they are enrolling in. The orientations are available on the WV STARS website, www.wvstars.org. Students can be either on the WV STARS pathway or registry. The orientations can be found on the training calendar by searching online courses.
- All students must complete and submit a registration form to ACDS. The registration form is part of the orientation and should be completed and uploaded into the WV STARS system. However, we will also accept registrations sent through email, mail and fax.
- 3. All students must submit the \$25.00 registration fee directly to ACDS. ACDS accepts business, personal and bank drafted checks and money orders made payable to River Valley Child Development Services (RVCDS). ACDS now accepts debit/credit card payments. To pay using a credit card visit the ACDS website or contact ACDS for a credit card submission form. We CANNOT accept payments over the telephone because the credit card submission form must be signed by the card holder. All forms of payments should be accompanied by the payment submission form also located on the ACDS website. Completing this form helps ensure that your payment will be credited accurately and timply.
