#### The Apprenticeship for Child Development Specialist

#### **ACDS Instructors Academy**

The Apprenticeship for Child Development Specialist (ACDS) is accepting applications for the annual Instructor's Academy to be held June 23 – 27, 2014. Participants must complete an intensive five day training to teach the ACDS class. They must also attend a one day update every other year to continue certification. From a personal perspective, being an instructor is a wonderful experience. It is very rewarding to witness the growth and development of students as they begin the program to completing fourth semester and then ultimately graduating. Many gain the confidence to continue their education and receive their associate and/or bachelor's degree. What a testament of the success of the program! #### ACDS Journeyperson (Graduate of the ACDS program)

An ACDS Journeyperson is a graduate of the program and has received their official Department of Labor certificate. Once your certificate is received, you're eligible to attend Journeyperson trainings. Typically, two are held each year in various parts of the state. The trainings focus on the most recent research and information relevant to early childhood professionals. Participants receive WV STARS training hours as well as a \$50.00 stipend. #### Health & Safety Grant Application for Subsidized Family Child Care Homes and Facilities

Every year family child care providers and family child care facilities can apply for a grant that can assist them in meeting health and safety requirements and to reward them for completing the requirements to move up a tier on the tiered reimbursement system.

#### So what does this mean to me as a child care provider?

Family child care providers and family child care facilities can apply for a grant each fiscal year for health and safety items such as safety gates, carbon monoxide detectors, fire extinguishers, flashlights, first aid kits and smoke detectors. Items that are specifically mentioned in the family child care registration requirements are eligible to be requested on the grant (child safety seats)

#### I am a new provider and in need of a lot of safety items, what do I do?

You can contact your local CCRC office for an application. Complete the application and return to your local CCRC. Grants are awarded based on the availability of funds and you can request up to \$250 per fiscal year for these items.

#### Can I purchase toys and equipment with this money?

At this time grant money can be used towards health and safety items and for curriculum materials. If you are in need of new toys, books, art supplies, these items are all available through our TRAILS (Traveling Resource and Information Library Services) program free of charge. #### Safe Sleeping Practice

SIDS is the leading cause of death for infants between 1 month and 12 months of age. About one in five Sudden Infant syndrome (SIDS) deaths occur while an infant is being cared for by someone other than a parent. It is crucial that we prepare a safe sleeping environment for our babies to lower the risk of SIDS and keep them safe from other dangers. Below are some helpful guidelines for safe sleep practice.

- Place babies on a firm sleep surface, covered by a fitted sheet that meets current safety standards.
- ♥ Keep soft objects, loose bedding, bumper pads, or any objects that could increase risk of suffocation or strangulation from baby's sleep area.
- ♥ Always place your baby on his or her back to sleep, for naps and at night, to reduce the risk of SIDS.
- ♥ Supervised tummy time when babies are awake
- Avoid overheating.
  - Do not overdress baby.
  - Never cover baby's head with a blanket.
  - o Room temperature should be comfortable for a lightly clothed adult.
- ▶ Infants should **not** nap or sleep in a car seat, bouncy seat, infant seat, swing, jumping chair, play pen or play yard or any other type of furniture/equipment that is not a safety-approved crib.

As always, infants should be directly observed by sight and sound at all times, including when they are going to sleep, are sleeping, or are in the process of waking up. # News from the Room

#### **Magnificent Music**

Music is an easy and fun learning activity that you can incorporate at any moment and for any age. Music is a great way to engage young minds, promote listening skills and serves as an outlet for children to release emotions and express their feelings. Music is known for enhancing memory skills as well, for example, most of us learned our ABC's through song! I challenge you to think about how you incorporate music in your daily schedules, you can create a calmer and smoother flowing schedule by incorporating songs during transition times and during activities. Some great points are shared below:

- Music is a language, and children are oriented toward learning language.
- Music evokes movement and children delight in and require movement for their development and growth.
- Music is an aural art and young children are aural learners. Since ears are fully mature before birth, infants begin learning from the sounds of their environment before birth.
- Developmentally appropriate music activities involve the whole child-the child's desire for language, the body's urge to move, the brain's attention to patterns, the ear's lead in initiating communication, the voice's response to sounds, as well as the eye-hand coordination associated with playing musical instruments.

#### Water Safety: Drowning Doesn't Look Like Drowning

The CDC states that drowning is the leading cause of injury deaths for children age 1 to 4 years. Of approximately 750 children who will drown this year, 375 will do so within 25 yards of a parent or an adult. It is important to realize that most downing's do not look like the downing's portrayed on TV or in movies. Most of the time there is no dramatic splashing, waving, yelling, or calling for help. For children, especially those who are not strong swimmers, it is important to pay attention to the subtle signs.

Here are some things to look for when a child is drowning.

- A wide-eyed or panicked look
- Mouth or nose sinking below the surface of the water
- Little or no arm movement. They may look like they are trying to grab something
- Pressing the palms of their hands on the water's surface
- A bobbing movement with their head in and out of the water
- No movement

Drowning can be easily prevented. Here are some tips to remember.

- Use Coast Guard approved lifejackets or life vests
- Never leave children unattended. Always keep an eye on children at all times
- Be close enough to grab the child in the water
- Use environmental protections (e.g. lifeguards, pool gates, pool fences)
- Suggest formal swimming lessons for the children
- · Learn and maintain CPR skills

#### What is Developmentally Appropriate Practice?

Developmentally appropriate practice (DAP) is an approach to teaching grounded in research on how young children develop and learn and in what is known about effective early education. Three core considerations of DAP are knowing about child development and learning, knowing what is individually appropriate, and knowing what is culturally important.

In the Developmentally Appropriate Classroom, children:

**Create**...rather than duplicate.

Move...rather than wait.

Attempt to solve their own problems...rather than tell the teacher, to have her solve them.

Speak...rather than listen passively.

**Explore their interests...**rather than just learning about what the teacher thinks they should learn.

Make choices...rather than being told.

Make their own lines...instead of coloring within the lines.

Write their own books...rather than fill in workbooks.

Create art...rather than do pre-planned crafts.

**Decide...**rather than passively submit.

**Learn through experience**...rather than by rote.

Appreciate the process...rather than the end product.

Ask questions...rather than being told facts by adults.



## Todd's Behavior Toolbox



Caring for young children can be extremely stressful. Several children may be asking for your immediate attention at the same time, you may feel that there is too much work to do and not enough time, and there may be tension with parents or other staff members. A little stress can be a good thing. It helps us focus on tasks to be completed and perform to the best of our abilities. Too much stress limits our ability to respond to situations in a calm and thoughtful manner. The use of harsh or inconsistent discipline can increase due to child care providers having too much stress and not having supports and management techniques in place to manage it. Signs of stress may include irritability, inability to sleep, headaches, and continuous worrying. Focus on sources of stress that you can control and develop strategies for responding in a more helpful way.

Here are some strategies for reducing stress and responding to stressful situations.

- Exercise regularly
- Reward yourself for a job well done
- Talk often with friends Avoid gossip and hurtful conversations
- Write in a journal
- Use deep breathing exercises to calm down
- Progressive muscle relaxation tense a group of muscles for a few seconds and relax
   Stop negative thoughts and replace with positive statements and solutions
