This training is intended to assist those who work with Children birth through age eight. The content will provide participants with strategies to assist young children in developing coping skills, self-regulation, and how to appropriately interact with others. Participants will also review how children process information around them and the different cues you may witness children experiencing. This training will assist teachers in finding ways to support each child's needs for learning. The general theme for the training will be centered around social-emotional development and how caregivers can support the children in their classroom.



Ages and Stages - Child Growth & Development - Intermediate Level -- Janice Barnett

This training will provide participants with an overview of the Ages and Stages Questionnaires. Ages & Stages is a screening program designed to be completed by parents or caregivers to pinpoint developmental progress in children between the ages of one month to 5 1/2 years. Participants will practice scoring and interpreting the tool. Handouts will be given as well as strategies for success. This training is geared toward teachers, directors, in-home providers, and parents.

<u>Building Relationships Through Family Conferences</u> - Family & Community Relationships - Basic Level -- Amy Morrow This training will present skills for effective parent conferencing, such as asking and listening. We will create an action plan and share ideas to improve our family conferences so they are a positive experience for everyone. This training is geared towards all types of providers caring for all ages of children.

<u>Infant/Toddler Learning Spaces</u> - Child Growth and Development (1 hour), Environment & Curriculum (1 hour) Basic Level -- Chrissy Pownell

Come and join us to learn ways to help your classroom be a wonderful place for Infants and Toddlers to learn. This training, along with your expertise, will provide information about what to include in your environment to help support the cognitive, motor, sensory, language/literacy, and social/emotional development of Infants and Toddlers

Infant Toddler Mental Health - Child Growth and Development - Intermediate Level -- Linda Reeves "Infant/Toddler Mental Health" refers to how well a child develops from birth to three. Understanding infant/toddler mental health is the key to preventing and treating the mental health problems of very young children and their families. It also helps guide the development of healthy social and emotional behaviors. Learn more about infant/toddler mental health and how important trusted relationships are for infants and toddlers

<u>ITERS - Importance and Value in the Classroom - Envir. & Curriculum - Intermediate Level -- Janice Barnett</u> The Infant/Toddler Environment Rating Scale-Revised is designed to assess group programs for children from Birth to 2 1/2 years of age. This training will provide an overview of the ITERS and allow participants the opportunity to practice observing and rating infant/toddler classroom environments. This training is geared toward center directors and infant/toddler teachers.

<u>Mandated Reporter: Reporting and Preventing Child Abuse & Neglect</u>-HSN-Intermediate Level -- Linda Reeves This training is a comprehensive training session for mandated reporters of child abuse and neglect.

Medication Administration - HSN - Intermediate Level -- Lisa Yost

This session will discuss proper administration of medication in the child care setting; guidelines of the WV Child Care Center Regulations (Minimum 5 - Maximum 20)

Oral Health - Health, Safety & Nutrition - Basic Level -- Renee Stonebraker

This session will focus on the importance of dental care for children and activity ideas for child care programs.

<u>Professional Ethics in Child Care</u> - Professionalism and Leadership - Basic Level -- Chris Gillis

Providers will gain an awareness of what appropriate ethical responsibilities they hold as child care providers. The Code of Ethics will be discussed as well as the difference between the Code of Ethics and personal values in the childcare setting.

Providing Culturally Sensitive Care - Family & Community - Intermediate Level -- Janice Barnett

By providing culturally sensitive care, teachers build children's confidence, competence and connections. This training will provide keys to providing culturally sensitive child care which will include discussions, videos, role play and relationship building strategies. This training is geared toward in-home providers, centers teachers, directors.

Stress Management - .50 hour Child Growth & Dev., .50 hour HSN, 1 hour Professionalism and Leadership Basic Level -- Renee Stonebraker

In this training you will learn facts about stress, how it affects our health, and healthy ways to deal with stress for adults and children.

Understanding the value of continuing professional development, Paula achieved the West Virginia Training Certificate in Early Care and Education (WVTCECE).

The West Virginia Training Certificate in Early Care and Education (WVTCECE) is awarded to early care and education practitioners credentialed on the WV STARS Career Pathway for completion of one hundred twenty (120) clock hours of registered training in the WV Core Knowledge areas. These training hours must be registered with WV STARS and be taken within five (5) years from the request date. To receive the WVTCECE, a participant must have an active Career Pathway Certificate and must have completed at least ten (10) hours in each of the Core Knowledge Content Areas and an additional fifty (50) hours in a combination of the Core Knowledge Content Area(s) of the participant's choice. What is the Key 2 a Healthy Start for WV's Children?

Did you know that approximately 32% of children ages 2-19 are overweight or obese? The trend begins in early childhood with 27% of children ages 2-5. By taking part in the **Key 2** a **Healthy Start** initiative, WV child care centers can become leaders in reducing childhood obesity rates in WV and raising a healthier generation of kids.

Key 2 a Healthy Start is a statewide quality improvement initiative in early care and education with the goal of preventing childhood obesity. Participating child care centers attend 3 one-day workshops that cover:

- * Nutrition
- * Garden-based learning
- *Parent Engagement & outreach
- * Physical activity
- * Personal health and wellness
- * Healthy celebrations



Workshop presenters include a pediatrician, registered dietician and pediatric exercise physiologist. Each participating program also receives on-site technical assistance visits after each workshop and will become part of a peer learning network. Key 2 a Healthy Start centers receive MyPlate portion plates and placemats, portable physical activity equipment, parent outreach materials, and much more! The workshops are free and WV STARS registered.


