

April - May - June Training Descriptions



Acting Out Activities! - Child Growth & Development. - Basic Level - Ali Svolos

This course covers why active learning is essential. It provides activities for categories including community building, prosocial skills, self-regulation, brain breaks and relaxation exercises. The activities are meant to be part of lessons, daily schedules, or to be used on-hand. The activities are geared to avoid challenging behaviors. **This session is for staff working with children ages 3 - 5.**

Creating a Self-Care Plan for YOU! - HSN; Prof. & Leadership - Basic Level - Missy Cuppett and Ali Svolos

Self-Care is more than just taking a bubble bath or going for a walk. It is the practice of taking an active role in one's own well-being and happiness, especially during times of stress. This training will help early childhood educators understand the different types of self-care and how to put a self-care plan into place while at home and at work!

How to Plant a Rainbow - Child Growth & Development - Basic Level -- Chris Gillis

Please join me as we review and discuss your most important role as an early childhood educator. The seeds we sow today, are growing the hearts and minds of tomorrow!

Improving Playground Safety & Supervision - Environment & Curriculum; HSN - Basic Level -- Missy Cuppett

Many of the injuries that occur in childcare settings happen while outside on the playground. This training will provide participants with multiple way to improve playground supervision/safety while working to decrease the number of incidents occurring on the playground. While this training is useful to any professional in the field, it is targeted toward those in the preschool and after-school programs as the children in their care will utilize the playground equipment often than our infant and toddlers.

Indoor and Outdoor Safety - Environment & Curriculum; HSN - Basic Level - Renee Stonebraker

Reviews common injuries for children, including falls and poisonings, preventive measures to reduce the risk of injury, and playground safety.

Let's Move- Child Growth & Development - HSN - Basic Level -- Renee Stonebreaker

Physical activity requirements for child care centers, age appropriate physical activities, and causes and prevention of childhood obesity.

Maximizing Learning in the Preschool Classroom - CG&D; Environment & Curriculum - Basic Level - Missy Cuppett

This training is for beginning early childhood educators seeking information on how to create a preschool classroom that will help our young learners thrive. This training will focus on the development of children ages 3-5 and appropriate classroom set up in a preschool classroom.

Mindfulness in the Pre-K Classroom - Child Growth & Development - Basic Level - Ali Svolos

This two hour course will provide participants with a base knowledge of what mindfulness is. The course will include strategies and practices on how to teach children mindful awareness and create a mindful classroom.

<u>Picky Eaters</u> - *HSN* ; *Child Growth & Dev.*; *Environment & Curriculum - Basic Level - Renee Stonebraker* How to encourage children to eat a variety of foods, including different cooking methods, family style meals and food shapes.

<u>Supporting Young Children's Friendship Skills through Social Emotional Learning</u> - *CGD* - *Basic Level* -- *Linda Reeves* At any age, having friends provides support and promotes mental health and wellbeing. Children's friendships are also very important for their social and emotional development. Through friendships children learn how to relate to others. This training will discuss the importance of promoting healthy early childhood friendships (birth-six years) using social emotional learning strategies.


Welcome to the Pyramid! An Introduction to Early Childhood Positive Behavior Intervention & Support (PBIS)

This training will provide an overview of the Positive Behavior Intervention and Support (PBIS) Module Series offered by the CCRC Behavior Consultants. Based on the Pyramid Model framework designed for young children (infants/toddlers/preschoolers), PBIS modules are designed to equip educators in early care & education environments with a toolkit of age and developmentally appropriate strategies to prevent challenging behaviors from occurring in the classroom and support the whole child.

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Apprenticeship for Child Development

Due to the COVID-19 epidemic, ACDS has held all classes virtually since March 2020. ACDS intends to return to in-person instruction as soon as it is safe to do so. A decision on the format for the Fall 2021 decision will be made in May 2021. You may visit the ACDS website, wvacds.org and the ACDS Facebook page in May to learn the details of the fall semester. Please note that the registration process has changed. There is now a deadline to register for classes. Please see below for the steps on registering for ACDS classes.

HOW TO REGISTER FOR CLASSES

- All students must complete an online orientation for the semester they are enrolling in. The orientations are available on the WV STARS website, www.wvstars.org. Students can be either on the WV STARS pathway or registry. The orientations can be located on the training calendar by searching online courses.
- All students must complete and submit a registration form to ACDS. The registration form is part of
 the orientation and should be completed and uploaded into the WV STARS system. However, we
 will accept registrations sent through email, mail and fax.
- 3. All students must submit the \$25.00 registration fee directly to ACDS. ACDS accepts business, personal and bank drafted checks and money orders made payable to River Valley Child Development Services (RVCDS). ACDS now accepts credit card payments. To pay using a credit card visit the ACDS website or contact ACDS for a credit card submission form. We CANNOT accept payments over the telephone because the credit card submission form must be signed by the card holder. All forms of payments should be accompanied by the payment submission form also located on the ACDS website. Completing this form helps ensure that your payment will be credited accurately and timely.

Health & Safety Grants

Health and safety grant applications are available through CCRC to family child care providers and family child care facilities in Hancock, Brooke, Ohio, Marshall, Wetzel, Tyler, Monongalia, and Marion Counties. The grants can be used to assist these home providers with meeting health and safety requirements as well as to reward them for completing the requirements to move up a tier on the tiered reimbursement program. Providers are eligible for up to \$250 for registered home providers and up to \$500 for family child care facilities once a year.

If you have not received a health and safety grant for this year (starting July 1, 2020) and are interested in receiving free health or safety items for your home please contact your local CCRC office to request a grant application.
