Breastfeeding Friendly Child Care Designation

This voluntary program is open to all licensed child care centers, registered facilities and family child care providers who choose to participate.

WEST VIRGINIA INFANT/TODDLER SPECIALIST NETWORK

Achieving this designation requires completion of ten steps. There is help for each step along the way. Training, educational materials and resources to create a breastfeeding space will be available. Remember, the breastfeeding area does not have to be a dedicated space used solely for this purpose. It may be a separate room or simply a nook in the infant room created with a privacy screen. Always check with your licensing or regulatory specialist for approval before making changes to your space.
Upon completion of the Ten Steps, each site will be awarded a bonus stipend, a certificate of designation and recognition during the Great Beginnings Infant/Toddler Conference are Calebrating Compositions.

April - May - June Training Descriptions

Balancing Screen Time with Early Childhood Development - CG&D - Envir. & Curriculum - Basic Level - Linda Reeves

Young children now have more access to multiple types of technology devices (smart phones, tablets, computers, gaming devices, Smart Boards, etc.) than any other time, thanks in part to the pandemic. The impact of screen media is changing the nature of early childhood development and is shown to have a profound impact on how young children learn, develop, behave and socialize. This training will examine the pros, cons, and unknowns of how technology and social media influences child development and impact personal and family relationships.

Creating An Autism Friendly Classroom - CG&D - Environment & Curriculum; - Basic Level -- Melissa Cuppett

This training is for early childhood educators seeking information on creating an autism friendly classroom through the use of visual schedules, social stories, calm down corners and more. This training was created for educators working with children in preschool/ pre-k/school age classrooms.

Identifying Environmental Hazards 1- HSN- Basic Level -- Renee Stonebraker

This training discusses how to eliminate environmental hazards found in or around buildings, including air quality, water quality, and lead.

Identifying Environmental Hazards 2- HSN- Basic Level -- Renee Stonebraker

This training discusses how to eliminate environmental hazards found in or around buildings, including plastics, arsenic, and asbestos.

Improving Playground Safety & Supervision - Environment & Curriculum; HSN - Basic Level -- Melissa Cuppett

Many of the injuries that occur in childcare settings happen while outside on the playground. This training will provide participants with multiple way to improve playground supervision/safety while working to decrease the number of incidents occurring on the playground. While this training is useful to any professional in the field, it is targeted toward those in the preschool and after-school programs as the children in their care will utilize the playground equipment often than our infant and toddlers.

<u>RR Spreading HOPE</u>- CG&D - Family & Community Partnerships - Intermediate Level -- Linda Reeves 斗

The Spreading HOPE training will cover the effects of ACEs on health outcomes, the importance of positive childhood experiences, and the research showing their mitigating effects on ACEs as well as the biological basis for these effects. We will introduce the four building blocks of HOPE and discuss type 1 vs. type 2 thinking. The presentation will present some ideas of how to incorporate the HOPE Framework into practice.

Understanding ACEs 101 - CG&D - Basic Level -- Linda Reeves

Adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) are potentially traumatic events that occur before a child reaches the age of 18. Such experiences can interfere with a person's health, opportunities, and stability throughout his or her lifetime. The Understanding ACEs 101 training will discuss ACEs and their impact on children and adults, introduce ways to overcome ACEs through resilience, and introduce strategies to prevent ACEs by shedding light on potential risk factors.

ITERS 3 Overview

The Infant/Toddler Environment Rating Scale-3 is designed to assess group programs for children Birth to 2 1/2 years of age. This training will provide an overview of the ITERS-3. This training is geared to Center Directors and Infant/Toddler Teachers.

The Growing Brain

July-September, 2023 & October - December, 2023

The Growing Brain is a 7 week/21 hour module series that focuses on brain development and strategies to support the growing brains of children, birth to 5 years old.

Mind in the Making is an 8 week learning process that uses research on children's development, including classic and recent studies on how children learn and how teaching can encourage engaged learning.

 The Growing Brain module series will replace Mind in the Making for the General Credential starting July 2023.

Health & Safety Grants

Health and safety grant applications are available through CCRC to family child care providers and family child care facilities in Hancock, Brooke, Ohio, Marshall, Wetzel, Tyler, Monongalia, and Marion Counties.

The grants can be used to assist these home providers with meeting health and safety requirements as well as to reward them for completing the requirements to move up a tier on the tiered reimbursement program. Providers are eligible for up to \$250 for registered home providers and up to

\$500 for family child care facilities once a year.

If you have not received a health and safety grant for this year (starting July 1, 2022) and are interested in receiving free health or safety items for your home please contact your local CCRC office to request a grant application.
