RR Spreading HOPE

Did you know most new parents return to work within the first year of their baby's life with little to no support through the breastfeeding process? The many benefits of breastfeeding for babies and mothers are immediate and long lasting. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), babies who are breastfed have a lower risk of: Asthma Obesity - Type 1 diabetes Ear infections - Sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS) - Severe lower respiratory disease

Childcare providers can play an important role in supporting a parent's choice to breastfeed. By earning the West Virginia Breastfeeding Friendly Childcare Designation, childcare providers commit to following best practices to support breastfeeding families and employees.

This program is open to all licensed childcare centers, registered facilities, and family child care providers.

Providers can receive start up materials and support from the Child Care Nurse Health Consultants, Child Care Health Educators, and Infant Toddler Coaching Specialists while completing the ten required steps for earning the designation.

After completion, each site will receive a bonus stipend and recognition at the Great Beginnings Infant/Toddler

Such experiences can interfere with a person's health, opportunities, and stability throughout his or her lifetime. The Growing Brain Module Series Training



In Person

This innovative training focuses on giving trainers evidence-informed strategies with which to prepare early childhood providers for their vital role in building healthy brains. The curriculum fills a unique niche by providing a comprehensive understanding of how the brain develops, along with ways the provider can encourage healthy brain development in children from birth to 5 years old.

Participants will learn skills and strategies for:

- 1. Teaching early childhood providers about brain development (architecture and neurobiology) to inform their practice.
- 2. Supporting language, cognition, prosocial behavior, and social-emotional development.
- 3. Reducing toxic stress that can negatively influence brain development of very young children.

Training Descriptions

<u>Creating Expression for Self-Regulations: Using Fine & Gross Motor Art Activities to Support Social Emotional</u> <u>Learning in Young Children</u> -- CG&D - Basic Level -- Linda Reeves

This 90 minute training will explore how art can be used as a powerful tool to foster social-emotional learning (SEL) in children from birth to six years. Participants will learn how fine and gross motor art activities support self-regulation, emotional expression, and social skills development. The session will cover practical strategies for integrating art into daily routines, and hands on activities that help young children process emotions, build relationships, and develop problem solving skills.

<u>Creative Curriculum for Infants/Toddlers and Twos Overview</u> -- CG&D- Environment & Curriculum -- Basic Level Andrea Littleton

This online training is a brief overview for child care directors and teachers serving infants and toddlers in a child care center. The training will review developmentally appropriate practice and how daily routines and meaningful experiences that are responsive to infant/toddler strengths, interests, and needs will help them gain confidence in themselves as learners.

<u>ITERS-3 Overview</u> -- CG&D - Child Ob. - Environment & Curriculum - Basic Level -- Andrea Littleton
This online training provides an overview of the ITERS-3 observation tool. Participants will learn what the ITERS-3 is and how it can be used to support learning and development in infant/toddler settings. Learners will also practice scoring observations.

Training Topic	Training Description
All About Allergies	Information about managing allergies in childcare setting, including food, insect, and seasonal allergies.
Communicable Diseases	Tips for minimizing the spread of infection in programs as well as information about common communicable diseases.
Creepy, Crawly Creatures	Information about parasites commonly identified in a childcare setting as well as guidelines for preventing an outbreak.
Diabetes in Child Care	This training includes information from American Diabetes Association Safe at School campaign regarding the basic needs that children with diabetes need throughout the day.
Morning Health Checks	Explanation about what a morning health check is as well as how one is conducted.
Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome	This training discusses the symptoms that infants exposed to substance in utero experience.
Summertime Safety	Playing outdoors is beneficial for children, but if proper precautions aren't taken, outdoor activities can be harmful. This training includes information about sun, water, and bug safety.
