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A Word from the Director

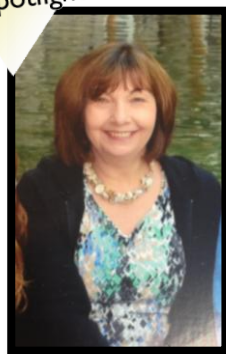
Dear Child Care Professionals:

CCRC is very happy to announce that Janice Barnett, *Early Childhood Specialist* has been accepted to become a NAFCC (*National Association for Family Child Care*) accreditation observer.

Janice completed an extensive application process and will attend an intense 2 day training in Scottsdale, AZ in July. NAFCC sponsors the only nationally recognized accreditation system designed specifically for family child care providers. NAFCC Accreditation is awarded to family child care providers who meet the eligibility requirements and the Quality Standards for NAFCC Accreditation. Accreditation reflects a high level of quality through a process that examines all aspects of the family child care program, i.e. relationships, the environment, developmental learning activities, safety and health, and professional and business practices.

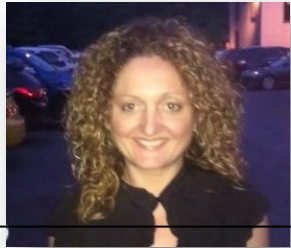

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, an estimated 71,000 children (18 years old and younger) are seen in the emergency departments each year because of unintentional medication poisonings (excluding recreational drug use). Children less than 5 years old are twice as likely as older children to be treated for an adverse drug event. Medication administration in the childcare setting is a serious responsibility with a high liability. West Virginia Child Care Center Licensing Regulation (8.6.g) states that prior to administering medication, the qualified staff member shall have training from an approved training source in medication administration. Best practice dictates that this training should be refreshed at least every two years.

The good news for those who need the refresher course, one will now be available starting in July for select centers. It will also be offered to the Child Care Resource and Referral agencies on a quarterly schedule beginning in October 2013. This class is designed for participants who have already successfully completed the original mandatory four-hour Medication Administration class. The refresher class will be a two-hour STARS credit training. If your center has at least five participants who need the refresher course, contact me personally by office phone at 304-366-3615, cell at 304-710-9065, or by email at hzbosnik@rvcds.org to schedule a training.

Culturally Sensitive Child Care

Culture is the fundamental building block of identity. Through cultural learning, children gain a feeling of belonging, a sense of personal history, and a security in knowing who they are and where they come from. A child's family background shapes early cultural experiences. Families hand down beliefs, attitudes, and ways of acting. These rules for living come from one's ethnic, regional, and religious heritage. Although the many cultures of the world evolve and change over time, each one passes down to its children recognizable and meaningful rules for living.

The following are keys to providing culturally sensitive child care:

1. Provide Cultural Consistency

Child care should be in harmony with what goes on at home. The child will sense the connection between child care and home and feel secure.

2. Work Toward Representative Staffing

Try to employ caregivers who are of the same culture and who speak the same language as the children served.

3. Create Small Groups

With small groups, caregivers have a manageable number of cultures to relate to and will have the time to truly know the family.

4. Use The Home Language

Using the home language strengthens the connection between home and child care and supports the child's identity with his or her home language. If this is not possible, caregivers need to be extra sensitive in order to respond appropriately to children's messages. All information should be translated into the family's language and an interpreter should be available to ensure ongoing communication.

5. Make Environment Relevant

The environment and materials of the child care program should reflect the children and their cultures.

6. Uncover Your Cultural Beliefs

By exploring your own background, you can see the roots of some of your child care practices.

7. Be Open To The Perspectives Of Others

Quality child care can be done in more than one way.

8. Seek Out Cultural and Family Information

You do not need to be experts in all cultures but you do need to be knowledgeable in the culture of the family you are serving.

9. Clarify Values- Communication is essential.

10. Negotiate Cultural Conflicts

Listen and come to an agreement that takes both people's values into consideration.

Dear Family Child Care Providers in Hancock and Brooke Counties,

I am very pleased to announce that I will be implementing the WV Elements of Family Child Care Series (WV EFCCS) using *The Creative Curriculum for Family Child Care* and *The Family Child Care Environment Rating Scale-Revised*. The WV EFCCS is sponsored by the WV Department of Health and Human Resources Division of Early Care and Education.

The WV EFCCS aligns with the West Virginia State Training and Registry System (WV STARS) Core Knowledge and Core Competencies and consists of a 30-hour training program. This seven part series, presented in 4-hour sessions, will provide a comprehensive overview of *The Creative Curriculum for Family Child Care* and how to use *The Family Child Care Environment Rating Scale-Revised*.

This training will guide you in making substantive changes in your family child care program that will improve the quality of early education for the children in your care. It will also provide you with 2 years of STARS training hours as well as **\$300.00** worth of equipment and/or supplies that will enhance your program.

You must be on the WV STARS Pathway and/or willing to register for WV STARS. I will support you with this process. You must be willing and able to attend all modules.

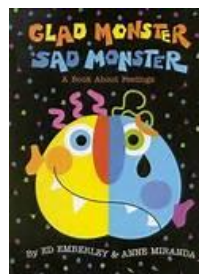
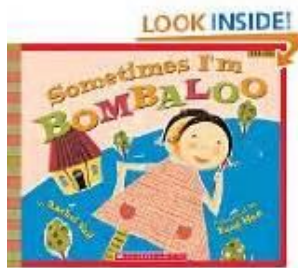
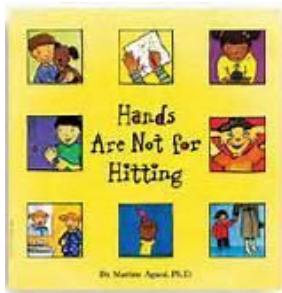


TODD'S BEHAVIOR TOOLBOX



Children's books are a wonderful tool for teaching children social-emotional skills. Many young children have difficulty with recognizing and managing emotions, interacting appropriately with other children, and controlling impulses. Lacking social-emotional skills can make it difficult for these children to develop friendships with their classmates and may lead to them being ostracized by their peers. It is important to intervene early to teach these children the skills necessary to develop positive relationships.

Children's books can be helpful in developing children's social-emotional skills in several ways. Reading books to children expands their vocabulary and can improve their listening comprehension and literacy skills. Books can also be used to model appropriate behavior in a variety of situations. Children may relate to the feelings and actions of the characters in the book. They may be encouraged to monitor their own behavior more closely after reading about a similar situation in a story. Books provide opportunities for discussion, small group activities, and role playing to practice appropriate social interactions. While reading the story, ask the children questions about the character's behavior and emotions and ask how they might act or feel in a similar situation. Following the story, allow the children to demonstrate the skills that were discussed in the story. The TRAILS Van has a large selection of children's books that can be used to teach social-emotional skills.

Its Summer time! Let's get the children! The sense of peace and pleasure when children take in fresh air, feel the warmth of the sun, and watch the nature all around them. Outdoor play is just as important as indoor play. A few things to keep in mind to help you and the children beat the heat!

 Be Aware of Sun exposure- Children need special attention, since they tend to spend more time outdoors, can burn more easily, and may not be aware of the dangers. Seek shade whenever possible. You should develop the habit of using sunscreen on exposed skin for yourself and the children whenever you go outdoors and may be exposed to large amounts of sunlight. If you or one of your children burns easily, be extra careful to cover up, limit exposure, and apply sunscreen. When using sunscreen be sure to read the labels, be aware of the SPF numbers (30 or higher is recommended). Most sunscreens must be reapplied every 2 hours. Be aware of children with skin allergies they may need a special sunscreen.

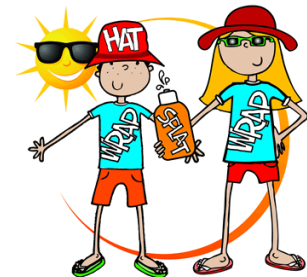
 Drink plenty of water- Make sure you have access to water. If you are hot then chances are the children are hot as well. By drinking plenty of water before and after going outside should help to avoid dehydration.

 Remember children and youth need to have a least 1 hour of physical activity every day.

Going outside can be lots of fun for everybody. Just remember to be cautious and use good judgment and everyone should have fun in the great outdoors.

8. **If schools are closed in the county that the training is taking place in, the training will be canceled.**




