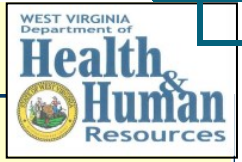

A Day in the Classroom - 1.5 hr. *Environment & Curriculum -- .5 hr. Observation & Assessment - Basic Level*
Presented by: Brie Broughman and Linda Reeves

Over 50% of a child's time in an early childhood settings is spent doing the basic routines and transitions required to move throughout the day. Let's use them as a teaching opportunity and add to a quality early childhood curriculum. By using transitions wisely, teachers will not only contribute to children's developing skills, but also run a more efficient program and create calmer settings. This training is designed for a teacher working in a child care center.

Bed Bugs and Beyond - HSN- Basic Level -- *Renee Stonebraker*

This training will include information on bed bugs, head lice, mice, rats and cockroaches and how to manage them at a child care center.

Big Feelings, Little People - *Curriculum- Intermediate Level -- Linda Reeves*

When you help children learn how to communicate their feelings and emotions effectively, you give them the social and emotional tools they need to defuse tense situations and to understand themselves better. This training will focus on teaching children about feelings and emotions and how to use their feelings appropriately to interact with others.

Hands-On Science for Young Children - *Environment & Curriculum - Basic Level -- Brie Broughman*

It is important for early childhood educators to create experiences that encourage discovery through play and exploration. At this training, teachers will experiment with a wonderful collection of safe, fun and easy activities. Projects can include simple demonstrations, craft projects or other science activities like sorting and categorizing things found in nature.

The Harmony of Learning - *Environment & Curriculum - Intermediate Level -- Amy Morrow*

This training will look at the benefits of integrating music into children's learning every day. Ways to encourage children to express themselves through music and movement will be shared as well as ideas for creating a music learning area. This training pertains to children of all ages and both center/facility staff and family child care providers.

Mandated Reporter: Reporting and Preventing Child Abuse & Neglect-*HSN-Intermediate Level -- Linda Reeves*

This training is a comprehensive training session for mandated reporters of child abuse and neglect.

Medication Administration - *HSN - Intermediate Level -- Glenna Bailey*

This session will discuss proper administration of medication in the child care setting; guidelines of the WV Child Care Center Regulations (Minimum 5 - Maximum 20)

Professional Ethics in Child Care- *Professionalism & Leadership - Advanced Level -- Janice Barnett*

Directors, teachers, and family providers will gain an awareness of what appropriate ethical responsibilities they hold as child care providers. The Code of Ethics will be discussed as well as the difference between the Code of Ethics and personal values in the child care setting. Each participant will receive a copy of the NAEYC Code of Ethical Conduct.

School Age Fun - *Environment & Curriculum- Intermediate Level -- Janice Barnett*

This training will help the director, teacher and family provider organize indoor and outdoor areas to support a variety of activities; Suggestions will be given for how to select and arrange developmentally appropriate materials and equipment; and also how to plan and implement a schedule and routine to meet children's development and individual needs.

Training Topics Offered July - September

Start Seeing Diversity - Creating an Anti-Bias Classroom - 1.5 hrs. Family & Community and .5 hr. Child Ob. & Assessment Intermediate Level -- Brie Broughman

Start *Seeing Diversity* provides a framework for understanding bias in the classroom and will help teachers recognize and reduce bias in young children. This training will introduce the 6 main areas of bias (gender, age, sexual orientation, race and ethnicity, economic class, and physical abilities); provide participants with several concrete examples of bias coming up in the classroom, and offer strategies to promote children’s respect for diversity.

Strengthening Our Families - 2 hrs. Family & Community and Professionalism & Leadership Basic Level -- Amy Morrow

Learn ways to develop appropriate and positive relationships with families as we look at the different ways we can respect families, communicate in a positive way and help connect families to the resources that they need.

WV STARS & The New System: “How to” for Participants - 1 hr. Professionalism & Leadership Basic Level -- Brie Broughman

This training will walk participants through the process of updating your STARS profile, searching and registering for trainings and tracking your professional development, We will also discuss the changes to the Core Knowledge and Core Competency Areas and review the Professional Development Planning Tool. Members of the WV STATE Training and Registry System (WV STARS) will experience working with the new system and learn the new tools it has to offer!

Please bring an IPAD, Smart Phone or Laptop to the training so that you may follow along and learn to navigate the website.



Trainings now list Basic - Intermediate or Advanced in the training description, this replaces the formerly used system of Tier I, Tier II and Tier III for trainings.

We have also listed the new Core Knowledge areas after the Training Topics, remember PIR (*Positive Interactions and Relationships*) is no longer a Core Knowledge area, as it is now woven throughout the remaining Core Knowledge and Competencies.

WV Family Child Care Modules in Wetzel & Tyler County

WV Family Child Care Modules are a 7 part series designed for registered family child care providers and will focus on specific needs that must be addressed, such as mixed age groups, organizing the home, record keeping, etc. Participants will learn how to implement the Creative Curriculum & evaluate their environmental using the Family Child Care Environmental Rating Scale. Participants will receive 30 hours of WV STARS training credit and resources to support and improve quality care.

MODULE DESCRIPTIONS & DATES

Building a Firm Foundation – Thursday, September 1st

Participants will learn about the importance of using quality curriculum and how to evaluate the family child care environment. Each participant will learn how to develop a professional portfolio and will have the opportunity to build that portfolio throughout the course.

Knowing How Children Learn- Thursday, September 8th

This module will provide participants an overview of how children develop and learn from birth through three years. Activities will be used to engage participants in learning developmental milestones and to learn about what to expect during these years.

Organizing your Day- Thursday, September 15th

The purpose of this module is to help family child care providers create a developmentally appropriate program that meets the need of all children in the program. It will show participants how to organize and prepare their home and develop and plan their weeks.

What Children Are Learning (Part 1)- Thursday, September 22nd

This module will discuss what kinds of experiences to offer children at each stage of development. It will specifically look at positive approaches to learning, language and literacy skills, mathematical relationships and exploring science.

What Children Are Learning (Part 2)- Thursday, September 29th

This module will specifically look at positive approaches to learning social studies and creative arts. Integrating learning with studies will also be discussed.

Caring & Teaching- Thursday, October 6th

This session will build upon prior modules and will present sound strategies for building relationships with children and families and guiding children's learning and behavior. Social/emotional development strategies will be covered along with ways to foster strong positive guidance.

Building a Partnership with Families- Thursday, October 13th

The purpose of this module is to present practical ideas to help family child care providers build and improve strong partnerships with families.
