1 ○ ■ ⌘ ◆
Switch up your dramatic play area with dress up clothes from our favorite stories! Use the hat from Cat in the Hat, Little Red Riding Hood's cape, or pigs masks for the 3 little pigs!

2 ○ ■ ⌘ ◆
Read Across America Day!
Invite the children in your care to read a story in pairs today. Can't read yet? Do a picture walk!

3 ○ ■ ⌘ ◆
Celebrate Dr. Seuss with a feast! Invite the children to try fun new foods such as Green Eggs and Ham, Who Hash, and Roast Beast!

4 ⌘
Happy Birthday David Pilkey, author of the Captain Underpants series! This series is great for elementary students!

5 ○ ■ ⌘ ◆
At bedtime, ask your child about their favorite, least favorite, and silliest part of their day. Ask them one thing they are thankful for. End with affirmations (ex. I am strong, I am a good listener).

6 ○ ■
Work with the children in your care to think of new verses for the "Wheels on the Bus".

7 ○ ◆
Work on infant's visual development by showing your baby their reflection in the mirror, then ask, "Who is that?" Repeat with your own reflection or a sibling's.

8 ○ ■ ⌘
It's Zoo Lovers Day! Can't make it to the zoo today? Search only for webcams of animals in zoos! Read books about animals today!

9 ■ ⌘
Count the number of steps it takes to get from one end of your house to the other. What about from your bedroom to the front door?

10 ○ ◆
Place a ball on the floor and gently roll it around in front of your baby. Practice rolling back and forth with toddlers.

11 ■ ⌘ ◆
Happy Birthday Ezra Jack Keats! Celebrate his birthday by reading *Whistle for Willie*, *The Pet Show*, *Goggles*, or one of his many other books!

12 ○ ■ ⌘ ◆
Ask each family member what their favorite song(s) is. Create a playlist and have a dance party!

13 ■
Rainbow Sorting
Using beads, counting bears, or pom-poms, invite the children to sort a group of items into the colors of the rainbow.

14 ⌘ ◆
Pi Day
Have students gather in small groups and race to see who can be the first to roll the first ten digits of pi. You'll need some Tenzi dice to do this!
Pi= 3.141592653

15 ○ ■ ⌘
Gold Coin Treasure Hunt
Using gold coins (or paper gold coins), send the children around the classroom on a hunt for coins. Count how many the children were able to find as a group!

16 ■ ⌘
Rainbow Paper Chains!
Work on patterns using the colors of the rainbow, cut strips of paper for each color. Invite the children to make paper chains with a rainbow pattern.

17 ○ ■ ⌘ ◆
St. Patrick's Day
Ask the children to wear green today while you read the book *Green* by Laura Seeger (or any other St. Patrick's Day book).

18 ■ ⌘
March has always been known for it's crazy weather. Spend a few days discussing the different types of weather we see in march. Track the weather as a group.

19 ○ ■ ⌘
Using Lego Duplo's or other blocks, work with your child to stack blocks. How high can you build? How many stacks can you make?

20 ○ ■ ⌘ ◆
Mr. Rogers Day!
Celebrate the life of Fred Rogers by wearing a cardigan and being kind to someone!

21 ⌘ ◆
World Poetry Day
Introduce your students to young writers such as American poet Amanda Gorman. Talk about different poems such as a sonnet or haiku.

22 ■ ⌘ ◆
Play restaurant as a family and take turns taking each others orders!

23 ○ ◆
Language Development for Infants
Sing & talk to your child using exaggerated tones of voice. Watch baby's facial expressions and reactions to different pitches.

24 ■ ⌘
Ask your child to create different letters or sights words using pebbles or rocks.

25 ○ ◆
Visual Tracking
While your baby is lying on their back, wiggle a toy in front of baby to get their attn, then move the toy side to side, encouraging baby to follow with their eyes.

26 ■ ⌘
Divide a large sheet of paper or poster board into ten sections, write a number in each section. Count out and place that many stickers in each space.

27 ○ ■ ⌘ ◆
Plant a flower together! Place a few seeds in a plastic cup 1/4 full of soil. Place in a sunny window and water daily! Watch it grow together

28 ○ ◆
Listening and Bonding Skills
Put on one of your favorite songs and, while holding your baby securely to your chest, gently move around together in time to the music.

29 ■ ⌘ ◆
Cut out different shapes on different colored paper. Work with your child to create a picture. Can you make a house using these shapes? What about a flower? What else can you make?

30 ○ ■ ⌘ ◆
Read the *Little Cloud* by Eric Carle. Discuss the 4 types of clouds. Using cotton balls, allow your child to form the clouds on paper with glue.

31 ■ ⌘ ◆
Spend some time in the kitchen baking with your child today! Try something easy like no-bake cookies or rice krispie treats!
