## Infant/Toddler News

### **The Environment in an Infant Toddler Classroom** *According to the Program for Infant Toddler Care*

The caregiving environment provides the setting in which the infant or toddler spends large amounts of time. The environment's ability to meet the growing child's physical, emotional, social, and cognitive needs is critical. Caregivers have many options in designing the setting so that it meets the child's needs for safety, health, security, and comfort.

The physical environment has a powerful influence over both children and adults. Young infants and toddlers are limited in their ability to leave or change their environment at the same time that they are particularly vulnerable to its effects. Child care environments for infants and toddlers need to support comfort and well-being in the daily activities of both children and caregivers.

**The infant/toddler caregiving environment should:**

1. Ensure safety
2. Promote health
3. Provide comfort
4. Be convenient
5. Be child-sized
6. Maximize flexibility
7. Encourage movement
8. Allow for choice

## The Fun of Play-Dough

Play-dough is an essential tool for any early childhood setting! Children get to play, talk, and learn together as they pound, roll, and make things.

While using play-dough, children are learning:

**Social and emotional skills** -by sharing and taking turns when using props to sculpt and mold their creations. Children also feel a sense of pride as they complete their project.

**Language and Literacy** – by rolling long snakes to create letters, telling you and other children what they are making and discussing new words such as cut, chop, and slice.

**Science and math skills** – by responding to your questions such as “what do you think will happen when...?”

**Fine motor skills** – by using hands fingers, and tools to pound, push, poke, shape, flatten, roll, cut, and scrape the dough.

### Play dough Recipe for Children

#### Ingredients for easy no cooking play dough recipe:

- Flour – 1 cups
- Boiling Water – 1 cups
- Cream of Tartar – 1 tsp.
- Salt – 0.5 cups
- Cooking Oil – 1 tbsp.

#### Directions for this easy no cooking play dough recipe:

- Mix all the ingredients together in a bowl until consistent
- You're done! Start playing!

**Just make sure to watch out using that boiling water!**

# Todd's Behavior Toolbox



## Family Involvement

Promoting a high level of family involvement in their children's early learning is an important aspect of early childhood education and a goal every program should strive to achieve. Positive outcomes associated with a high level of parental involvement in their child's early education include school readiness skills, social skills, communication skills, and cognitive development. There are many ways that families can be included in the early education program. Communicate with families about what their children are learning and provide activities and suggestions for continuing this learning at home. Learn about the cultures and traditions of the families in your program and celebrate them in your classroom. Talk with parents about positive behavior strategies that are used in the classroom to manage challenging behaviors and support them in using these strategies at home in order to build consistency. Welcome family members into the classroom to volunteer their time. Open communication between school staff and families will make families feel included and welcomed as an important part of their child's education.

Family involvement should include fathers and other males as well as mothers. Children with fathers that are involved in their education have more positive outcomes. Many men may feel uncomfortable participating in the early childhood classroom. There are strategies that can be used to make them feel at ease. Have them help with maintenance projects around the school or planning a school and family picnic. Hire male staff and encourage males to volunteer at the school and include pictures of male role models and fathers in the classroom. Hold special events with fathers in mind to encourage them to attend with their children. Men will be more likely to participate if they feel they are welcomed and that they can contribute to the school in a meaningful way.



The Mind in the Making Modules is a 12-part learning process that uses research on children's development on how children learn and how teachers can encourage engaged learning.

This practice is used in center or home-based settings.
