Ages and Stages - Child Growth and Development - Intermediate Level -- Janice Barnett

This training will provide participants with an overview of the Ages and Stages Questionnaires. Ages & Stages is a screening program designed to be completed by parents or caregivers to pinpoint developmental progress in children between the ages of one month to 5 1/2 years.

<u>All About the Creative Curriculum for Preschoolers</u> - Environment & Curriculum - Intermediate Level Presented by: Brie Broughman

The Creative Curriculum for Preschool is a scientifically based, comprehensive curriculum for programs serving children from 3 to 5 years old. In this training, teachers will learn about effective learning environments, will develop daily schedules and incorporate intentional teaching.

Bed Bugs and Beyond - HSN- Basic Level -- Renee Stonebraker

This training will include information on bed bugs, head lice, mice, rats and cockroaches and how to manage them at a child care center.

<u>Creating a Child-Centered Environment</u> - Environment & Curriculum-Intermediate Level -- Brie Broughman A Child Centered Environment is one of the most important elements of offering developmentally appropriate early childhood programs. This training will explore the elements of a child centered environment in which children's ideas, preferences, learning styles and interests are considered and teachers offer hands on, play based, child centered programs.

<u>Creative Curriculum - Partnering with Parents</u> - Family & Community - Intermediate Level -- Brie Broughman Partnering with families is a central component of *The Creative Curriculum*. This training will help teachers build positive relationships with families by addressing the following topics: Communicating with Families; Involving Families in the Program and Responding to Challenging Situations.

<u>ECERS - Early Childhood Environment Rating Scale Overview</u> - Admin. & Management - Intermediate Level Presented by; Brie Broughman The ECERS Overview will provide and overview of the Early Childhood Environmental Rating Scale. Participants will learn how to assess the environment and interactions in the classroom as well as identify strengths and areas for improvement

<u>I Spy With My Little Eye: Anecdotal Notes!</u> - *Child Ob. & Assessment - intermediate Level -- Amy Morrow* This training will teach child care teachers and providers how to follow appropriate procedures of child observation and assessment. We will take a close look at how to execute anecdotal records and way to use findings to support instruction, learning and collaborating with caregivers.

<u>ITERS - Importance and Value in the Classroom - Envir. & Curriculum- Intermediate Level -- Janice Barnett</u> The Infant/Toddler Environment Rating Scale-Revised is designed to assess group programs for children from Birth to 2 1/2 years of age. This training will provide an overview of the ITERS and allow participants the opportunity to practice observing and rating infant/toddler classroom environments.

Lets Move - HSN- Basic Level -- Renee Stonebraker

This workshop will discuss the physical activity requirements for child care centers, age appropriate physical activities and causes and prevention of childhood obesity.

<u>Mandated Reporter: Reporting and Preventing Child Abuse & Neglect</u>-HSN-Intermediate Level -- Linda Reeves This training is a comprehensive training session for mandated reporters of child abuse and neglect.

<u>Medication Administration</u> - HSN - Intermediate Level -- Lisa Yost

This session will discuss proper administration of medication in the child care setting; guidelines of the WV Child Care Center Regulations (Minimum 5 - Maximum 20)



<u>Moving Right Along - Transition Tips & Tricks in the Classroom</u> - Envir. & Curriculum -- Intermediate Level Presented by; Linda Reeves

Transitions are times in the daily schedule of the classroom or childcare room when teachers/providers and children move from one activity, place or adult to another. Transition times occur many times throughout the day and can help children learn schedules and what to expect. Participants will learn how to plan and implement smooth transitions to increase educational activities and decrease behavior problem.

Neo Natal Abstinence Syndrome - HSN -- Basic Level -- Lisa Yost

Learn about the rise in national opioid use, its direct effect on neo natal abstinence syndrome and the role of the child care provider in providing supportive management to infants who are born addicted to drugs.

Picky Eaters - HSN - Basic Level -- Renee Stonebraker

In this session participants will discuss ways to encourage children to eat a variety of foods including different cooking methods and family style meals.

<u>Stress Less for Your Success</u> - *Professionalism and Leadership - Intermediate Level -- Amy Morrow*Participants will gain an insight on positive and negative stress along with the different ways we respond to stress. We will use reflections to modify our work with children, families, and colleagues and set personal goals. Stress management techniques will be shared and practiced.

<u>West Virginia ELSF for Infants and Toddlers</u>- Child Growth and Development -- Intermediate Level Presented by: Janice Barnett This training will provide an opportunity for participants to explore the West Virginia Early Learning Standards Framework for Infants and Toddlers (WV ELSF IT): its purpose, content, application and benefits for professionals, programs, parents and children.

WV Family Child Care Modules in Wetzel County

WV Family Child Care Modules are a 7 part series designed for registered family child care providers and will focus on specific needs that must be addressed, such as mixed age groups, organizing the home, record keeping, etc.
Participants will learn how to implement the Creative Curriculum & evaluate their environmental using the Family Child Care Environmental Rating Scale. Participants will receive 30 hours of WV STARS training credit and resources to support and improve quality care.

MODULE DESCRIPTIONS & DATES

Building a Firm Foundation – Thursday, September 1st

Participants will learn about the importance of using quality curriculum and how to evaluate the family child care environment. Each participant will learn how to develop a professional portfolio and will have the opportunity to build that portfolio throughout the course.

Knowing How Children Learn- Thursday, September 8th

This module will provide participants an overview of how children develop and learn from birth through three years. Activities will be used to engage participants in learning developmental milestones and to learn about what to expect during these years.

Organizing your Day- Thursday, September 15th

The purpose of this module is to help family child care providers create a developmentally appropriate program that meets the need of all children in the program. It will show participants how to organize and prepare their home and develop and plan their weeks.

What Children Are Learning (Part 1)- Thursday, September 22nd

This module will discuss what kinds of experiences to offer children at each stage of development. It will specifically look at positive approaches to learning, language and literacy skills, mathematical relationships and exploring science.

What Children Are Learning (Part 2)- Thursday, September 29th

This module will specifically look at positive approaches to learning social studies and creative arts. Integrating learning with studies will also be discussed.

Caring & Teaching- Thursday, October 6th

This session will build upon prior modules and will present sound strategies for building relationships with children and families and guiding children's learning and behavior. Social/emotional development strategies will be covered along with ways to foster strong positive guidance.

Building a Partnership with Families- Thursday, October 13th

The purpose of this module is to present practical ideas to help family child care providers build and improve strong partnerships with families.
